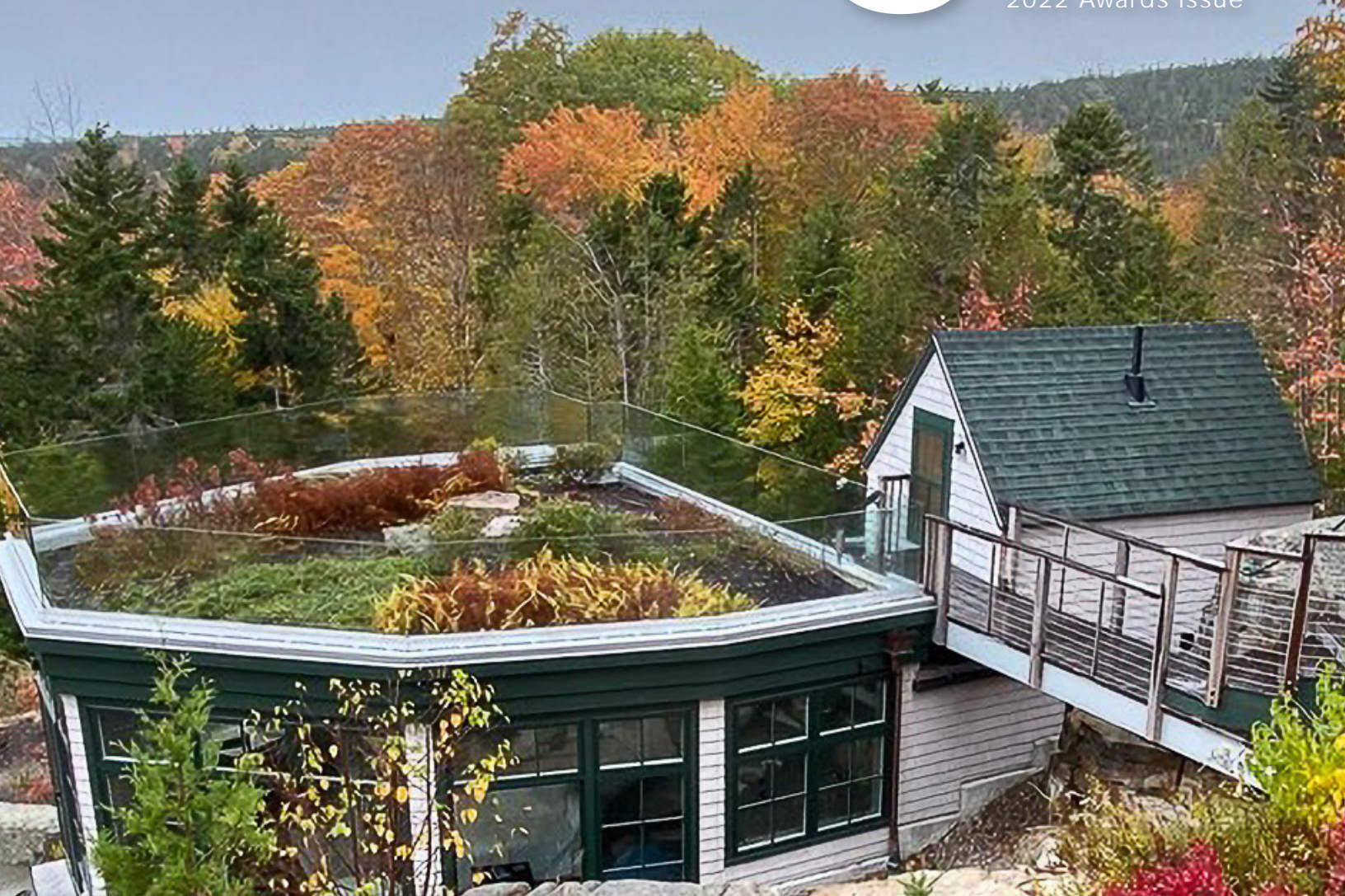

Designer of the Year, Bobbie Burdick, was contacted by owners about a 100-year-old cottage located on their coastal Maine property. The couple inquired about renovating the house, hardscapes, and landscapes, supporting their vision of incorporating the look and feel of the site’s existing surroundings. The clients wanted a seamless yet functional flow that naturally ties their indoor and outdoor living together.

JUDGES’ FEEDBACK: The design and craftsmanship are masterful—a beautiful blend of New England with contemporary on a very difficult site. The plantings blend beautifully with the surrounding vegetation, and the rooftop garden brings interest to what would have been a flat, dull roof. Excellent job.

The cottage rests on a plane with varying grades, surrounded by untended woodland. Bobbie stated, “we intended to make the landscape seamless to the natural surroundings.” Consideration of the structure, the terrain, contours, surrounding unmanaged woodlands, and the purpose of connecting outdoor and indoor living spaces to promote a functional design. Further regarding the design, they provided a series of conceptual drawings for the cottage and detailed landscape design, Bobbie said. She elaborated on how the infinity roof “evolved, like an infinity pool, such as the view was forest” instead of overlooking city lights.

Unobstructed views were necessary because the client’s primary request to the Burdick Team was that the property had character. Thus, the design had to be represented by its environment. Designing a small structure for a growing family included siting a cottage, addressing drainage, and using new physical elements to bring together three primary planes: base, vertical and overhead, for creating connectivity of both the indoor and outdoor spaces. The results are a mixed use of materials and textures, endemic plants, creating a color palette that integrates natural surroundings, and new structures that consider plant growth, variety, and seasonal variations.

JUDGES’ FEEDBACK: It’s all in the details, and the quality of the additions works seamlessly to the composition.

JUDGES’ FEEDBACK:

A perfect application for a green roof. The difficulty of the site offsets any criticism I’d have. Bravo. I love the green roof plants. Kudos for not using all sedum!

Supporting the low-water-use natives is a drip irrigation system. The Burdick team also installed rain chains for overflow. A recirculating water feature with a stone veneer foundation is also a landscape feature to enhance irrigation. The Burdick team had many aspects to consider bringing the design of the Cottage House/Infinity Roof to fruition, with such items as the elements, location, internal subdivisions, transparency, focal points, and elevation changes.

And it’s true! It is all in the details. Bobbie’s team was responsible for the cottage’s concept, siting, subcontracting an architect to design the structure, landscaping, grading, drainage, plant installation, and renderings. Bobbie noted that others performed landscape features such as the installation of lighting, stonework, the infinity roof structural engineering, and soil media. With all teams coming together, the cottage house/infinity roof located on the coast of Maine is simply astonishing.

When we imagine a place suspended between heaven and earth, we visualize living art, colorfulness, subtle temperatures, fresh scents, community relaxing, playing, and absorbing all nature offers in a place of peace. Gold award-winning Best of Show, by Gavin McWilliam, McWilliam Studio, must have also imagined such a place, as he so eloquently described it as a “transitional space between its past and present.” As one of the judges proclaimed, “garden spaces should evoke all senses” they are a place for sparking thought and relaxation through “scent, sound, and air.”

JUDGES’ FEEDBACK: Between Heaven and Earth is a glorious stirring of everything we have within. Very well done. It must have been quite an experience for show attendees.



Designed initially for the Shenzhen Flower Show, the show garden does not disappoint. The garden contains many of the same materials found in typical gardens. However, the awesomeness of Gavin’s design relies on the materials and elements in use. More so, he scaled with vertical elements, inserted sculptures, boulders, and water features, and used LED lighting and paths to blend them into living art.

best of show



The significant water elements take its cue from the Pearl River Delta, and the Shenzhen's dense network of canals and waterways. The further detail of the use of water provided cohesiveness unifying the landscape, while the backdrop of the woodland softens the garden's edge.

JUDGES' FEEDBACK:
Anchoring nature and contemporary design in an aesthetically pleasing manner that flows seamlessly is a visual delight.

Between Heaven and Earth is a “beautiful reality.” Looking up, there are Madagascar Almond trees, paired nearby with tall poles, topped with tiny LED lights that gently sway and draw the eye skyward. Although representative of Shenzhen’s technical ambition and aspiration, stated McWilliam, the light also illuminates a dark space. “An incredible show garden from within and above, yet a wonderful stellar concept and implementation” for all to enjoy.

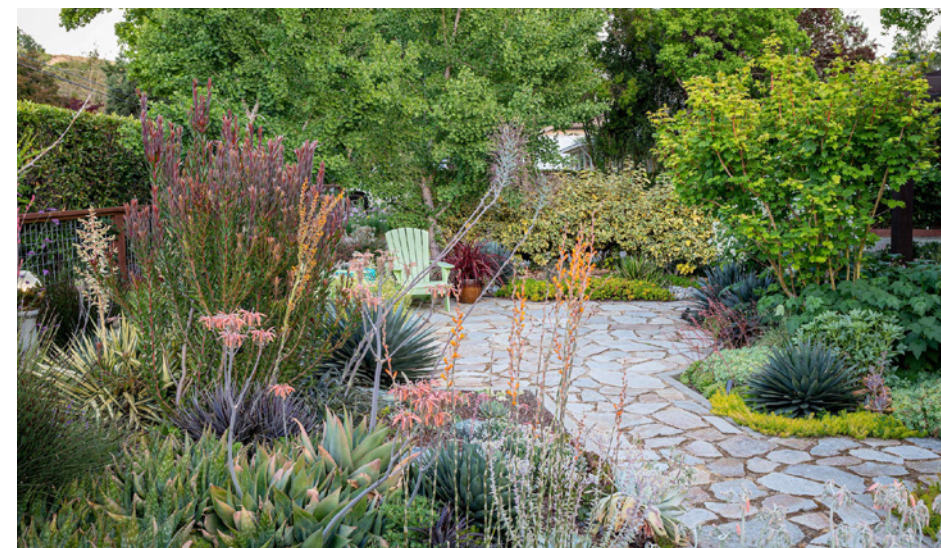

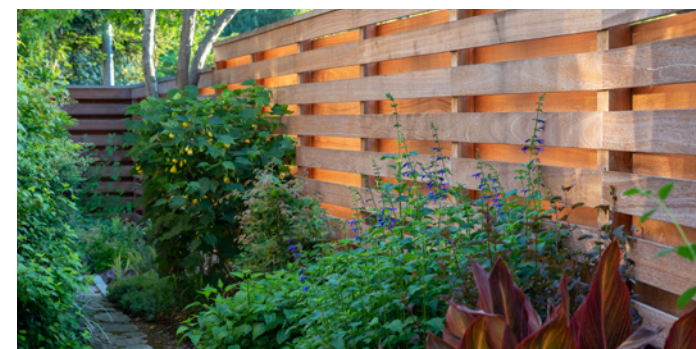


JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

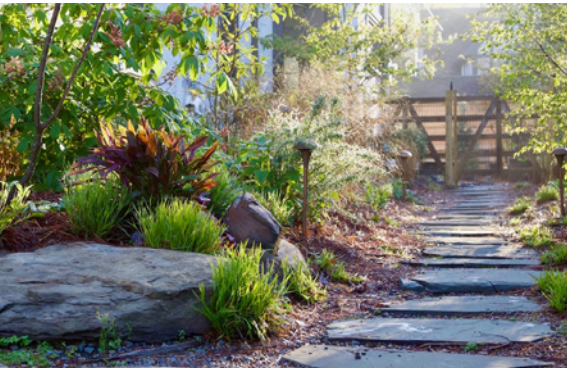


The rear garden extends the lines of the house, and the edges resolve to focus back to the outdoor living. This design has a great structure and composition that is functional.

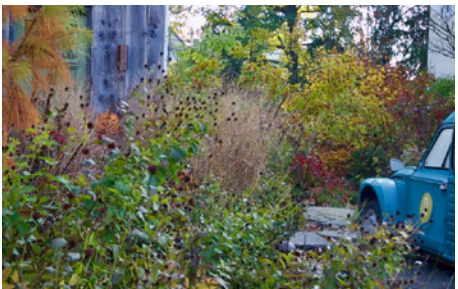

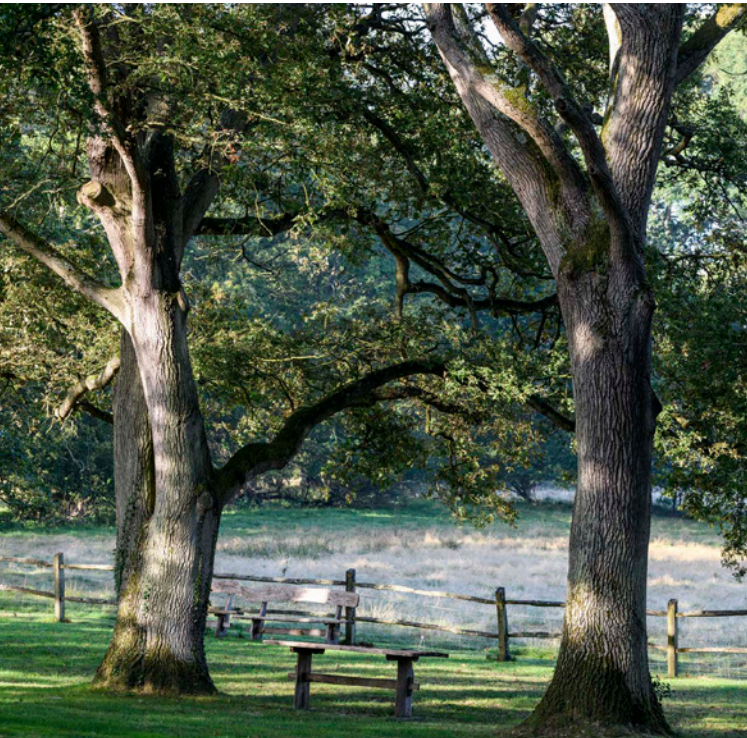

JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

The running bond bluestone at the entrance transitions to 1x1 squares by the water feature, signaling the visitor to slow down.



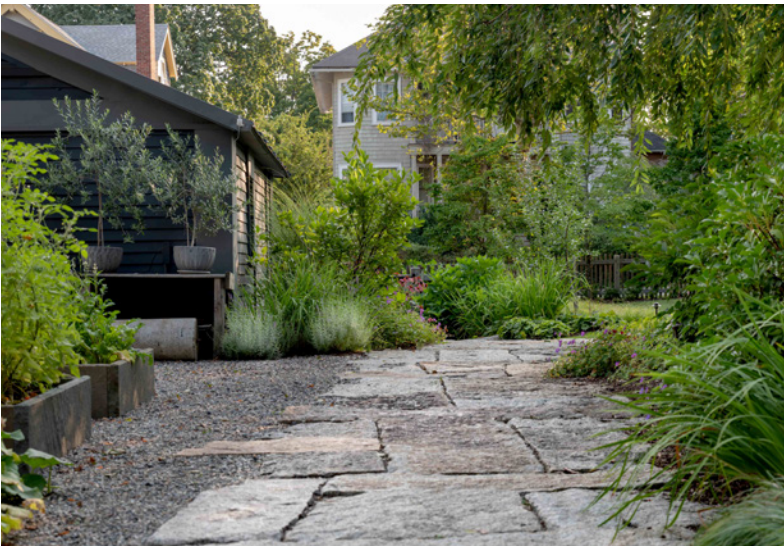

We worked with materials that felt durable and crafted, and we also incorporated plants that were drought-resistant and displayed as much multi-seasonal interest as possible.

The reclaimed stone with edges blended to softscape and relaxed geometry. It is altogether a softer hardscape, well-integrated into the land and appropriate for the age of the architecture.

The stone wall along the front yard is very unifying. The streetside planting design is eye-catching, and the garden has a rural feel while in an urban setting. This design has great space planning, materials and execution.
