

Integrating the rugged allure of a seaside nature preserve with the energy of cantilevered structural architecture challenged Katherine Field and her team to create a seamless transition between interior and exterior spaces.

On a long, narrow lot in coastal Rhode Island, 2024 Landscape Designer of the Year Katherine Field blended the clean lines of her clients' new home into a delightful landscape with artistic, natural touches in her design, "Fen's Edge."

Following the development of a modern beach home at the top of their sloping property, Field's clients sought a picturesque landscape that would connect them with the natural beauty surrounding their property. The owners recognized that the home's large picture windows and inviting patios would draw attention outdoors, so they pursued Field's expertise as Chief Creative Officer & Principal of Kathrine Field & Associates, Inc. to create a scene worth joining. The property's architecture, sloped topography, surrounding landscape and seaside location presented intriguing challenges, which Field and her team turned into compelling design opportunities.

The scope of the project included a new pool and integrated spa, a kitchen and cutting garden, a Zen Garden, a custom outdoor fireplace, a custom outdoor shower, a Corten Steel installation, stone walls, entry posts and plagues and overall site lighting and planting.

Judges praised Field's site plan and the emotions it invokes.

"When a design makes you say 'Wow!' it's got to be special," said one judge. "This design... has well-defined garden rooms, incredibly rich materials, plus amazing beds overflowing with plants. The designer did a wonderful job of considering the 'place' and making sure elements of the site, plants and culture were woven throughout."


"A very nice plan," said another judge. "This project emits emotion, which every great landscape should. The elements of stone and steel moving within the space are lovely... I would be thrilled to own this landscape."

"With the architectural changes, the gardens and landscape are stellar. The site grade changes were handled well with functional and attractive site areas," another judge stated. "Materials and forms are excellent; a work of art."

The Inspiration

Field makes multiple site visits when planning a design. The insights she gleans there, paired with her extensive studies and experiences, guide her design process.

In this design, Field gleaned inspiration from the home's architecture, the surrounding landscape and the nearby beaches of Rhode Island. However, the landscape remained the team's "primary geometry" or guiding principle, she explained. "We were doing everything to have the natural landscape – which we could not change – accent what we were doing and vice versa, so that our work would enhance the natural," said Field. "We did not do anything that became... a barrier to the visual experience that extended from the house through our landscape area and right out into the natural area."

Understanding her clients and their desires also fueled Field's inspiration.

"We want our clients to have the best experience and to have them fall in love with nature," said Field. "If they can have that moment where the sun's just right and they feel it on their face, and a... cooling breeze and hear certain kinds of birds because we created a habitat for them. That is the fourth dimension of our work."

Embracing the Grade

Grades add complexity to projects, especially when working in a fragile, seaside environment.

"The grade was a real defining factor for how this landscape sat relative to the building," said Field. Field's team embraced the grade by imagining three terracing levels: the driveway/parking, the pool terrace and the main entryway.

"The idea that there were these thrusting structural elements to the architecture sort of set us in the idea that the pool itself could be that same form, could have that same energy," said Field. "We minimized the amount of walls and pathways around the pool and just had it be as if it were that cantilevered terrace above."

The pool terrace, containing both pool and spa, travels out of the natural slope away from the house, mirroring the architecture of the house. Field's team then utilized board form concrete walls around the pool to create another connection to the modern architecture.

Breaking up the grade with multiple sets of stairs accented by Corten Steel opened perspectives to the accompanying gardens and terraces. The varied native plantings along the walkway softened the modern lines, fostering an inviting connection with the earth.

Runoff from the roof and hardscapes and overall drainage had to be carefully managed to minimize disruption to the fragile environment. To address this issue, Field's team directed the water to a rain garden at the bottom of the site, planted with natives that gradually transitioned to a natural plant mix at the street level.

Designing Next to "The Fen"

Field's clients loved the neighboring property – a wild, beautiful protected landscape known as "The Fen."

Bordering "The Fen" and other traditional beach homes with little delineation between properties elevated the importance of blending the client's modern aesthetic with the seaside environment. Field's team responded by pulling natural patterns and colors into design elements and materials to create a seamless transition.

Designing "Fen's Edge" and the conservation's setback requirements also shaped aspects of the design particularly the outdoor shower.

Field and the architect discovered a fitting solution by overhanging a fully cantilevered outdoor shower in the setback. To unite it with the house and the surrounding natural landscape, her team used a bronze shower enclosure to match the house and frosted glass panels to let in light while maintaining privacy.

Unifying Element of Corten Steel

Using Corten Steel to unify the design throughout the site added accents that both break down the scale and beautifully change the experience over time.

Field and her team used the material in a variety of artful ways. For the fireplace, they separated two sheets of Corten giving the feature a warm glow. Corten Steel highlighted entry post plaques, cutting garden beds and terraces, bent path lights and retaining "walls" throughout the slope to break up the stairway leading to the main entry.

Field also used Corten Steel in the pool fence design, which has a special story. Her initial inspiration came from the dune fencing along Rhode Island beaches, but she ran into a quandary as the pool terrace extended out.

"The grade dropped off and at a certain point, you had a natural four-foot high pool enclosure wall. The pool enclosure fencing... started to devolve into what you will see on the beach, missing pickets and at an angle. [It] became a very abstract design element," shared Field.

She wasn't sure how to space the fence or what height to give its pickets. As she worked, music was playing.

"I kept singing. I kept imagining [my clients] out there. It's beautiful sunshine. And so I took the musical notes from 'Good Day Sunshine,' the Beatles song and [placement of the notes became] the spacing."

Field's clients love the look and the special meaning behind the installation.

Advice for Aspiring Designers

Field strongly advocates for aspiring professionals to obtain their landscape architecture licensure because of the knowledge and immense value it provides.

When designing, Field encouraged designers to lean into the process: "Lean into your project and make every moment in connection mean something," she said. "And always be of the mind and heart of your clients. Experience this for them way before they ever step foot on it."

Develop trusted relationships with tradespeople. If you don't have a team that's been on-boarded, make appointments and visit their shops, Field encouraged. "I much prefer to bring [the tradespeople] all together... and learn from them what the opportunities and constraints are so that your design is not in a vacuum. You're respecting the skill sets that they have."

The devil can be in the details, so Field encourages being present during all of the placement of details to ensure it is done right.

Embrace challenges as opportunities: "Don't be afraid when you come up to a roadblock or if you think something's too hard. Just lean in because that's where the best design comes," said Field.

Field feels humbled and grateful for the award and highly praised her team: "Knowing that the work they're doing has been recognized and is being given and honor is just so important for them."

A 29' grade change. Protected trees. A drought-prone climate. Any of these could give a designer nightmares. Instead, David Thorne's team tamed the design diablos into a stunning, functional success.

In the misty hills of California, under an oak tree canopy, 2024 Best of Show winner David Thorne, Principal/ Owner and Founder of David Thorne Landscape Architect (DTLA), and his team transformed a dated, concrete and red brick landscape into a breathtaking masterpiece titled "Westside Diablo."

Thorne was tasked with renovating an outdated landscape into sophisticated, family-friendly areas that fit the personality of the clients, their active, young children and pets.

The complex project encompassed reconfiguring a retaining wall, creating more space for an upper terrace, updating guard rails, building a custom fountain, designing floating stairs with expanded landings, updating an outdated pool and deck, adding a fire feature, buffet counter, outdoor shower and spa and planting design.

Judges were impressed with the exquisite transformation of the challenging site, complementing material usage, spatial division and scaling and blending of spaces.



"The before is hard to believe with the after photos," said a judge. "Design and development – a paradise with views."

"The stair sequence is a thing of dreams," another judge shared. "Users are transported through the tree tops while minimizing impact to the tree roots. The established trees offer history and a sense of place."

"Selected materials beautifully update the elements and surrounds... Layered plantings, including many natives, completes the connection of spaces," praised another judge. "Superb execution, attention to detail and fulfillment of client's wish list."



Inspiring the Design

The client's interest, passion and drive heightened the creativity of Thorne's team.

"We had a very unique client... [who] really wanted something no one else had. She kept pushing us to be as creative as possible – not only in the big ideas but also in the individual details of the design," said Thorne. "We were really inspired to modernize it and make it a very special environment to suit their personality and lifestyle."

The site, perched on the top of a hill with beautiful views of Mount Diablo, had both significant potential and constraints that demanded creativity.

"There were a lot of challenges to overcome," said Thorne. "For a lot of projects, everything is kind of flat... This [project had] so much topography that you're really viewing this lower pool area from above. So, we wanted to make sure that it looks fantastic from above... and hangs together as an art piece."

Appeal of the Upper Terrace

After reconfiguring the existing retaining wall to offer a patio space for parties and a lawn for kicking a soccer ball, Thorne's team bordered the lawn with custom iron guardrails.

A walkway of large, bright white pavers leads guests past a custom-made fountain, a beloved feature of the client and Thorne's team.

"The whole office has a soft spot for the fountain," explained Thorne. "We designed it and contracted board and place concrete, then added some copper scuppers and spouts, into the design. It's an amazing little feature."


The youngest clients agree, enjoying the feature as a bath from time to time.

Overcoming the Slope

Descending from the upper terrace to the lower pool terrace is a whopping slope that is about five playground slides long. Finding a way to connect the two spaces while not making the trip below an uncomfortable trek was a feat.

"The biggest design challenge that necessitated the most creativity on this project was the staircase that leads from the upper terrace down to the pool area," said Quintana Kardel, Director of Operations at DTLA.

"A daunting 29 feet of grade change and a lot of existing native oak trees... [made us] question how to make this program element safe, functional and beautiful, along with respecting... the existing site conditions as much as possible."

The solution emerged as a floating staircase descending into the oak canopy. A series of landings offered moments to pause and become immersed in the experience.

To build the floating stairway, Thorne's team designed footings that made a minimal impact on the protected oak trees' root structure and the slope.

Thermory, a thermally modified timber with lightweight, long-lasting properties, was selected to blend into the natural canopy and lessen the weight on the slope.

For the railings, Thorne selected dark-colored powder-coated metal to blend into the shadows. He credits his father's fascination with how light hits differently on rotating steel columns with the inspiration for this decision.

A Breathtaking Poolscape

Descending from the tree canopy showcases the drastic transformation of the poolscape from an aerial perspective. The view showcases the clean, contemporary lines of the upgraded pool and deck. The crisp colors of the design are complemented by warm woods.

"I'm most proud of the pool area. I think the visual impact of the pool [when] seen below, with modern materials and the white tile extending out through the stairs... It's a total transformation," said Thorne.

The pool space offers everything one may need to enjoy a full day – including the fire feature, buffet, outdoor shower and spa. Large pavers running along one side of the pool echo the walkway on the upper terrace, uniting the two spaces.

Choosing Plantings for the Climate and Sustainability

One of the ways Thorne and his team soften their designs is through plantings. While this part of California is mostly a temperate climate, it has been growing increasingly hotter and drought-prone.



"We might not get rain for six months, so that makes the plant selection very challenging," said Thorne. "To respond to that, we prioritize mainly native. There are some spots of color, but it's a drought-resistant palate, especially in those areas of the native oaks."

Because the clients have a young family, a lawn and recreational space on the upper terrace were important. Thorne's team incorporated space for the client but kept it to a minimum. They also included a small lawn on the lower pool terrace.

"The use of native plants, really minimizing the lawn... and keeping those mature, beautiful trees healthy were all top of mind as we came up with our design solutions," said Kardel. "The irrigation system is all inline, drip irrigation, which is much more efficient and water-wise as well."

Winning Best of Show

"I'm really thrilled to win the award this year. It's a jury of our peers... so, to win this one elevates the smiles in our office," shared Thorne.

"Behind every great design is a team of people including everyone at DTLA that worked on this project, our amazing collaborators, Ecliptic Landscape, Aquapool Construction and Lafayette Ironworks for the custom metalwork," said Thorne.

"[We also thank] our clients who really pushed us to think outside of the box and were a dream to work with, including their young daughter who showed a real interest in the process."

Advice for Emerging Designers

Document your work

Thorne encourages using the highest quality photography you can afford. "Your images are so critical and are a passport to your future work. Invest in them accordingly and curate them carefully.

Build your community

"Develop deep relationships with whoever is leading the charge to assemble great design teams," urged Thorne. "Your relationship with your clients is hugely important, but think bigger. The relationships you form with architects or interior designers or general contractors can be equally fruitful."

Smaller, Softer, Newer Older
 Thorne's team heard this mantra at a conference last year and embraced it.

"[It means] reduce hardscape and lawn whenever possible. Choose softer materials whenever possible (i.e. gravel versus concrete). Lean into newer sustainable technologies with materials. And reuse or recycle as many existing elements of the site as possible," said Thorne.

"Have sustainability top of mind with all of your client interactions and subsequent designs. The urgency to find solutions to address the changing climate is something we all need to embrace."









JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

I'm a big fan of the dedication to straight natives, particularly in proximity to a national park. The result is not messy or neglected, but soft, lush, and well-placed. Use of the black locust and flagstones connects well to the new home. I love the connection to the park and that nothing impedes the view into it. I applaud the lack of water use and keeping roof runoff on site.





This is a beautiful transformation. There's very nice plant layering and textural quality in a limited space. 






JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

This is a beautiful upgrade of the gardens. The addition of an address wall with layered plantings adds much needed definition to an entry that is far away from the house. The remake of the walkway to the 'front door' reflects thoughtful design and spatial awareness. Beautiful plant layering, textures, and color invite you in and lead you along in a seamless fashion. Materials are well chosen for the site and architecture creating a harmonious connection among the spaces.



JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

The existing, mature trees provide a beautiful canopy that gives the space a relaxing and cozy feel. The walkways offer easy circulation and divide the garden into nicely balanced spaces that flow together while accommodating the retained trees. The decks and patio are well done and nicely make use of the existing central tree as a focal point.

JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

This is a thoughtful and well-crafted design that considers many elements of the home, neighborhood, and region. I particularly like the trellis focal point and the fact that you can see it from the front door. I appreciate the flexibility of the design, how areas feel intimate while also working together for larger gatherings. The deck at first floor grade is a great extension of the living area and will accommodate those with limited mobility, allowing them access to the garden. The plant choices are in keeping with the traditional home and offer multiple seasons of interest.



JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

Replacing the most of the lawn with vegetation beautifully elevates the aesthetics of the space, making it more inviting, welcoming, and filled with opportunity for birds and other wildlife. It feels like it went from black and white to being in color: the monotonous lawn is now long sweeps of color and texture that follow the walls and existing curved lines.

The circular water feature enhances and adds functionality to the council ring, making it an even stronger focal point. The circle pavers seem to have a different energy and vibe than the rest of the garden. While functional as a walkway, they interrupt the long, flowing lines, and calm spaces that define the garden.

JUDGES' FEEDBACK:

Such a beautiful design on a potentially challenging site. I am most impressed with the location of the pool area. Looking at the plan initially I was taken aback by the location (in the front yard surrounded by a driveway), but when I saw the final design via the photos, I was shocked at how well this space tucked into the site. 






JUDGES' FEEDBACK:






JUDGES' FEEDBACK:
